

#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT: MAY 2025

The past couple of months have been a funny old period for the parish council. The election for a new parish council was announced in Mid-March, following which the parish council went into what is known as "purdah", that is, the period of six weeks before the election when no



new business may be introduced. The election was held on 1<sup>st</sup> May and various formal business had to be completed, such as the completion of Declarations of Acceptance of Office, and the annual council meeting was held on 14<sup>th</sup> May to elect the new officers and pursue other formal business. However, here we are with a full complement of ten parish councillors elected to serve for the next four years and raring to go. The full list of parish councillors appears elsewhere in this magazine.

One notable event during the pre-election period was the hustings organised by **Perran News** as an independent arbiter and thanks are due to Mark Gripper and Chris Lea for conducting the meeting in a very professional manner. This novel occasion provided local electors with an opportunity to quiz the candidates for election with a variety of questions being put and a strict time limit on replies. This was the first time this novel approach had been attempted in the parish and those who attended seemed to think that it had been quite successful.

One piece of business that was concluded immediately before period of purdah began was the completion of the amalgamation of the playing field charity with the village hall charity so that there is now a single charity running the combined site of the village hall and the playing field. This makes much more efficient use of resources so that the trustees of the Perranwell Centre can concentrate on running their charity and the parish council can concentrate entirely on its powers and duties as a local authority rather than having to act as both a local authority and a charity trustee. To those who may be concerned about the future of the playing field, it will continue to enjoy exactly the same protection against disposal as it did when the parish council was the trustee. The parish council will continue to contribute towards the cost of maintaining the playing field.

At the annual council meeting, the council decided, in the light of previous experience, to slightly alter its structure to make its approach more flexible. The council will maintain a planning committee, which will meet monthly, and a small staffing committee to oversee staffing matters, but will discontinue a separate finance committee. Four working groups will continue to operate but will now work in different ways, rather than all attempting to meet bi-monthly. The Highways & Footpaths Working Group, renamed as the Highways & Public Rights of Way Working Group, will meet monthly because it has many practical matters to resolve and a gap of two months between meetings was too long. The Emergency Planning Working Group will meet only as required as most of the practical matters have already been addressed and it basically sits in stand-by mode. The Environment Working Group will also meet less frequently but the main focus of its work will now be on delivering key events that will each focus on major concerns, such as climate change, rewilding projects, increasing the use of green energy or increasing bio-diversity. The Community Liaison Working Group had already decided that it would meet three times per year. The overall effect of these changes is that there will be fewer formal regular meetings, with the full council and planning committee meeting on the first Wednesday of the month and the Highways & Public Rights of Way Working Group on the third Wednesday of each month and any other meetings being slotted in around those. This should allow councillors more time to contribute to other key matters.

So, off we go. The new parish council is very much looking forward to seeing you at parish council meetings, listening to your concerns and delivering improvements on your behalf over the next four years. *Colin Bridges, Chairman*

April was a pleasant month, mostly dry with plenty of sunshine. That is, apart from the period 14th to the 18th which witnessed over three quarters of the month's total rainfall, including 1.71 inches in the 24 hours to the morning of the 16th. These few days boosted the rainfall to twice the April average, the highest since 2012, but not at all representative of the month's weather generally.

Winds were exclusively from the South and South East up until the 13th, along with anticyclonic conditions in the second week and at the end of the month. Unsurprisingly, therefore, sunshine hours were well above average, although not quite matching April 2021.

Maximum daytime temperatures were some 1.4C above average, while night-time minima were close to normal. The month ended with a mini heat wave (relatively speaking for April) which extended into the first week of May.

Nationally, April was the UK's 3rd warmest April on record, and the sunniest on record as well. Interestingly, the highest rainfall over a 24 hour period anywhere in the UK was recorded at Otterham, near Camelford, on the 15th/16th, a very wet 3.33 inches.



#### THE COUNT IN THE CATHEDRAL

High Cross 0915 May 2<sup>nd</sup> 2025: Notice at Truro Cathedral West door:

"The cathedral will be closed to visitors today for a private function"

The "private function" is the counting of votes in the fifteen county council wards of the Truro Falmouth constituency. Democracy in action.

Tall burly security men on the West door, and inside the building, not a clerical "dog-collar" in sight. The council hires security from Plymouth for today. Probably an easy trip out for the chaps, compared with being bouncers on the doors of the clubs in Union Street. After church, will they be returning early, for some Friday night rough and tumble at chucking-out time in Plymouth early Saturday morning?

Admission to the "private function" is by invitation only. Election Candidates and supporters must complete forms to go on a list before the day. Photo ID to be presented on admission to witness the count. My blue paper "Guest" wrist bracelet is attached by a kind lady inside the cathedral entrance to enable readmission after leaving the building during the day. No picnic lunches to be eaten in the cathedral.

Having never visited a night club, where a bracelet or ink handstamp is issued, wearing the wristband was rather exciting.

As team Lib-Dem is briefed on how the day works, a couple of High Cross benches start filling up with the local Reform crew. Very stylish rosettes in Cambridge Blue, rather less stylish suits and shoes. I feel sure one of them once knocked on my door, "Tarmac, your drive tomorrow for cash in hand, guvnor, no VAT? Want any tree work? "Another fellow was tall and orange, with bouffant grey hair, and a blue suit, but not American. Were his initials DT I wonder?

Inside the cathedral the nave has been cleared of chairs for services and rearranged with rows of tables for the tellers. The tellers are surrounded with black and yellow striped cordon-tape to clearly mark where followers and candidates must not step beyond. Foot soldiers and hopefuls are milling around on the periphery. It is permissible to stand behind the tape, a metre or so in front of the tables where the counting is taking place.

The sealed ballot boxes labelled by polling station are standing ready. Box seals are broken and the contents tipped in a heap in front of the tellers. The final furlong of the race begins. The Perranarworthal box is second of the five polling stations to be opened. The tellers carefully unfold the papers and form them into neat piles of twenty, each pile paper-clipped together. For the keen-sighted candidate monitor overseer, it is possible to see the placement of crosses on the ballot papers as they are unfolded. Should have brought my distance specs. Luckily my champion's crosses are at the top of the ballot paper. I can roughly count them on my tick chart to get an early idea of how things are going. Maybe not too bad.

A heap of folded papers is now a serried rows of packets of twenty. Named wire baskets are arranged, one for each candidate, in front of two teams of tellers. Now the main event. Heading for the finish line. Maximum excitement, maximum elation or maximum disappointment not far away. The ballot papers are individually read and dealt into the candidate's baskets. Normal rules are reversed. Wanted, an overfull in-tray, not an empty one, hoping your candidate's basket fills quicker than the opposition. Until a substantial number of ballots are dealt it is hard to see the difference in the sizes of the piles. As time passes the differences in tray mounds becomes more apparent. Some smiling faces, some sad, a barometer of candidate's fortunes. Early completed counts are starting to be announced by midafternoon. As the count finishes adjudicators assess spoiled ballots. Our ward votes unlike some, I am pleased to say, had very few spoiled with profane remarks about politicians.

Nearly done. Growing smile as there is a convincing difference in the tray piles. I might burst with paternal pride. The ballots are now finally counted. Our candidate is comfortably ahead, and after all the checks and balances complete, declared winner for Mylor, Perranarworthal and Ponsanooth. Hooray.

All fifteen council wards of the Truro Falmouth constituency are counted, as are parish and town councils being contested. Our parish council is amongst them.

I was fortunate to witness the fact that the UK mechanism for electing representatives is still peerless in integrity despite depending on human counters and voters using a pencil to make their choices. Counting the votes is slow, labour intensive, takes most of a day to complete, but is impressively resistant to any kind of fraud or cheating. Having been to previous counts without success I once again realise how much work a large number of candidates and their supporters put in and walk away empty handed. Been there done that. No silver or bronze here.

After all the miles with leaflets on the mean streets, time to get my shoes repaired and a new outer tyre for my electric bicycle. *MBG*

## "Old trumperty forgotten" The inventory of goods and chattels of Josias Pearne, late of Perran-ar-worthal

#### **Speaker: Dr Joanna Mattingley**

Dr Mattingly will decipher the inventory attached to the will of Josias Pearne, late of Perranarworthal parish, who died in 1639.

The original will is held at Kresen Kernow, but a copy of the accompanying inventory was found by Geoff Ryall among the papers of his father Eric. It lists all of Josias's goods and chattels, room by room, and in the hands of a skilled historian it reveals fascinating insights into his personal and household arrangements.



Dr Mattingley studied medieval and early modern history at London University. Her PhD was based on the Middle Thames valley, but having lived in Cornwall for over 30years, her interests have expanded to cover Cornish local history and customs. She is a bard of the Cornish Gorsedd

#### CARNON STREAMWORKS AND THE BRONZE AGE TIN INDUSTRY

#### **Speaker: Steve Hartgroves**

The talk on the Bronze Age houses discovered during the construction of the Carnon Downs bypass, scheduled for March, had to be cancelled due to the ill health of the speaker James Gossip of Cornwall of Archaeological Unit. Instead our Chairman Steve Hartgroves stepped up to unfold the remarkable tale of the Great Carnon Valley streamworks, beginning with the harsh rock-shattering climate condiditions of the last ice age, and the creation downstream of mineral-rich alluvial deposits once the climate improved around 10,000 BC.

He went on to describe the artefacts recovered by tinners from the basal layers of the streamworks at the end of the 18th century - including a pickaxe made from a red deer antler and a wooden shovel made of oak - and explained how these had recently been dated to the Early Bronze Age. He then outlined how newly developed techniques of scientific analysis have enabled archaeologists to identify the geographical source of minerals such as tin and gold contained in BronzeAge tools and ornaments.

The results strongly suggest that much of the tin and gold in the earliest Bronze artefacts across Northern and Central parts of Europe originated from Cornwall! It is now being proposed that Bronze, the alloying

of tin and copper, was invented in Cornwall and the techniques and the raw materials were exported far and wide 3500 years ago.

This means that tin mined by small farming communities in Cornwall and Devon was being traded across Europe and reaching the ancient kingdoms and states in the East Mediterranean over 4000 km away. This has significant implications for our understanding of South-West Britain's role in the wider Bronze Age world. The volume, consistency and frequency of the the tin trade is far larger than has been imagined and requires an entirely new perspective on what Bronze Age miners and merchants were able to achieve.
