

#### **PARISH COUNCIL REPORT: JUNE 2025**

Requests are frequently made for more information about the parish council's finances; for example, a specific request was made at the recent annual parish meeting. The parish council's accounts for 2024-



25, that is, to the end of March 2025, have recently been approved by our internal auditor and have now been dispatched to our external auditor. The internal auditor is appointed by the parish council itself and examines the rigour of the accounting procedures used by the council, whereas the external auditor is appointed by central government to ensure that all rules and regulations have been met. As part of the external audit procedure, public notices have recently been displayed with a summary of the council's financial position and informing members of the public of their right to inspect the parish council's accounts. The summary accounts are shown below.

Where the variance is greater or less than 5%, the parish council is required to provide an explanation to the external auditor. The increase in the precept was to meet increased staff costs (see below for details), to improve the maintenance of public rights of way and to ensure that reserves met the level set by the council's reserves policy. Reserves had dropped to a worryingly low level.

The decline in "total other receipts" was due to the fact that the parish council did not receive any large grants in 2024-25 as compared to the previous year when major grants had been received for new play equipment.

Staff costs for 2024-25 represented the cost of a full year for the new Clerk who was contracted for more hours than the previous Clerk and also enrolled in the Cornwall Pension Fund.

#### Warm, Dry and Sunny

A very pleasant month, dominated for much of the time by high pressure bringing a gentle easterly breeze. Daytime temperatures were about 2C above average, just pipping 2022 and 2023 to make 2025 the warmest May in my records going back to 1987. The temperature reached at least 20C on 8 days in the month.

Sunshine totals were well above normal, while rainfall was only some 53% of the long-term average. There were only 6 "rain days", days when rainfall was at least 0.04 inches.

Wind speeds were lower than average, coming from an easterly quarter for most of the month, reverting to the South West in the last week.

Nationally it was the 5th warmest May on record.

#### Spring 2025

Taken together, the months of March, April and May 2025 were also warm, sunny and dry. Sunshine hours totalled 625 against a long-term average of 514. Rainfall totals were down, however the main anomaly was in the number of "rain days" (see above). There were only 22 such days out of a possible 92, compared to an average of 35.

#### June Update

The first half of June has been slightly cooler than May, with winds swinging around to the westerly quarter. Apart from a couple of days, it has also been appreciably less sunny. However, the main change is that it has been wet, three and a quarter inches of rain falling by the 14th, much to gardeners' delight.



#### In the village

Firstly, huge congratulations to everyone involved in Perranfest, what a brilliant event. It was so nice to see everyone out enjoying themselves, and as many of you will know I'm always happy to eat cake for a good cause! A really impressive sum raised for the school too – congratulations and a big thank you to all the volunteers who made it happen.

I joined PC Helen Newton at her recent surgery in the village hall. Many of the enquiries I have received so far are about road safety. PC Newton highlighted Operation Snap (https://www.devon-cornwall.police.uk/OpSnap) where members of the public can submit digital footage of dangerous driving offences, and I'm looking forward to joining our speedwatch group at a future session.

Alongside health and wellbeing, travel and transport will also be a priority for the Community Area Partnership which met recently. The CAP brings together parish, town and Cornwall Councillors from across the local area to work on shared concerns.

#### Community transport scheme – let me know your views

Continuing on the transport theme, I've had a few conversations with people about setting up a community transport scheme in the village. This was something that residents mentioned during the recent local election campaign, and I'd like to gauge wider interest.

Different schemes work in different ways, but essentially this would be a network of volunteer drivers who can help take people to appointments and local places that people can't get to via public transport.

Is this something you would like to see? Would you use it? Might you be interested to volunteer, either as a driver or on the phone as a coordinator? It's very early stages, but do let me know what you think.

#### **News from County Hall**

The new Lib Dem/Independent Cabinet recently met for the first time. Council meetings are webcast, so you can always tune in online if you want to watch what's going on, and members of the public can ask questions (you need to submit these in advance). There were three main announcements.

Firstly, the new council has scrapped plans to outsource council-owned car parks. Secondly, the council has cancelled the sale of Newquay airport. Finally, there will be a review of the Council's arms-length companies to make sure the governance arrangements are effective and that they are providing value for money. It was good to see this positive start from the new administration which has promised to focus on getting the basics right.

As for me, I'm really pleased to be on the health and adult social care scrutiny committee, where I'll be asking questions of health and care leaders about services for people across Cornwall.



#### **BOOK REVIEW: Question 7 by Richard Flanagan**

Wednesday, June 17, 1881, a train had to leave station A at 3 a.m in order to reach station B at 11 p.m.; just as the train was about to depart, however, an order came that the train had to reach station B by 7 p.m. Who loves longer, a man or a woman?



This question was posed by Anton Chekov and Question 7 is also a memoir written by Richard Flanagan, winner of the 2024 Baille Guildford Prize for Non-Fiction. On this note, we can rock and roll into the exciting **Perran News** book review corner. I could just say it's an awesome read and recommend it, however, the book reviewer perhaps ought to be a little more expansive. Hmm, well, Flanagan, of aboriginal descent, writes about his father being taken prisoner in Japan during World War Two. His father was transported by the Japanese on the notorious "hell ships", prisoners near naked and crowded together through typhoon and monsoon to a coal mine 80 miles south of Hiroshima. He was underground when the "little boy" atom bomb was dropped by American pilot Thomas Ferebee, opening the B-29's bomb bay at an altitude of 31,000 feet. Then, writes Flanagan, the bomb was "no more than vapour and energy along with the 60,000 Japanese souls ascending to heaven. That's life". Flanagan's father survived.

So Flanagan explores the great 20th century moral dilemma of how right or wrong the Americans use of the nuclear weapon was. He brilliantly depicts a love affair between HG Wells and Rebecca West as being a catalyst.

Nuclear physics. His father said he would not have survived another winter. Some prisoners were stripped naked and made to kneel in the snow, through the night, to death.

The defining image of the 20th century might be NASA photography of the the Earth from space or it might just be that initial nuclear test at Los Alamos. The Manhattan project and a nation dedicating scientific ingenuity to creating devastation. The calutron was invented by E O Lawrence and used to enrich the Uranium, driven by a series of electromagnets around what they called the racetrack. The racetrack was 100 feet long and 20 feet tall. There wasn't enough copper to make coils for the magnets because of the war effort so the U.S Treasury trucked in fourteen thousand tons of silver. U-238 is three neutrons heavier than U-235 so it follows a greater arc in the magnetic field. Uranium enriched, bomb ready.

Back to the Flanagan book. He describes his near-death experience in his early twenties. Yes. "I lay there, clutching the earth like a mad thing, panting, hearing it breathe, astonished, hearing myself breathing in response. I wanted to go forward as part of that great movement, I wanted to live every day.. I wanted to waste none of it. And as the world continued rolling through space with me hanging on, I could not believe my good fortune". Question 7. Richard Flanagan.
